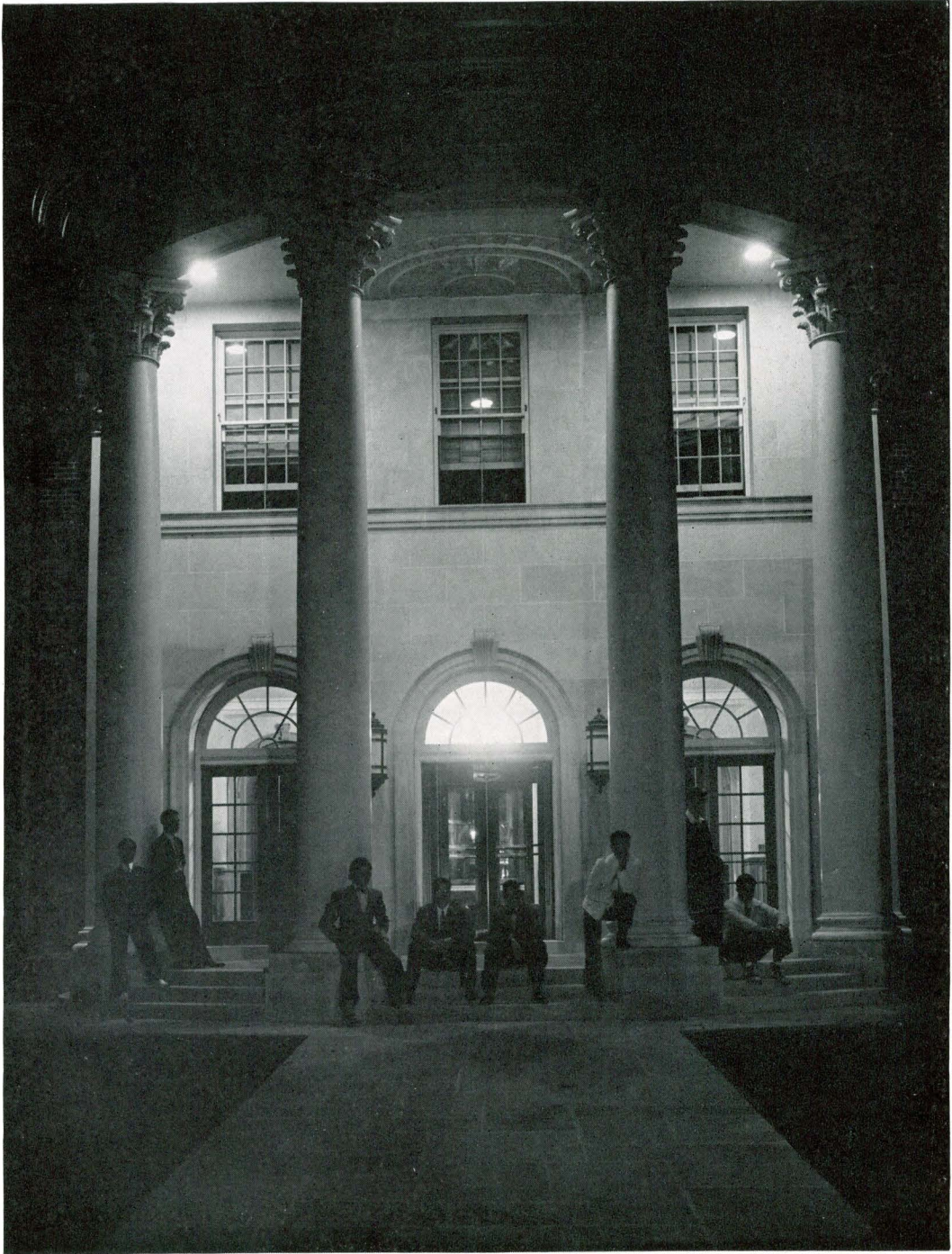

These pages present a composite of the life which has molded the boy and girl of yesterday, into the man and woman of today.



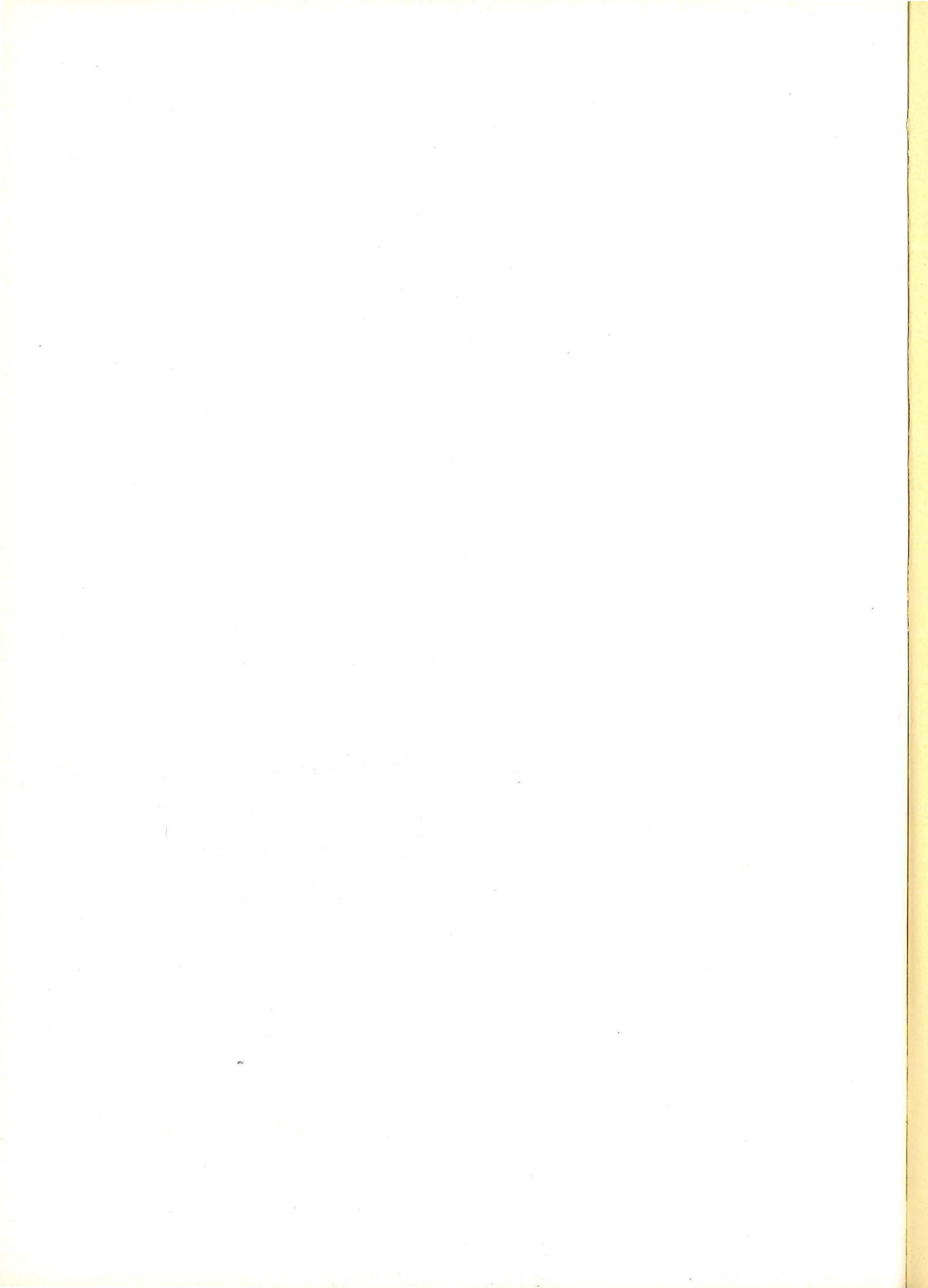
