MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE FACULTY SENATE

February 1, 1979

The Faculty Senate held its fifth regular monthly meeting of the 1978-1979 school year on Thursday, 1 February 1979 in the Library Science Reading Room of the Rohrbach Library, Chairman Ottinger presiding. The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Also present was Michael Plunkett as an observer for the Student Government Board.

The Chairman asked for a motion to adopt the agenda. Dr. Grabowski made the motion for adoption. Dr. Sexton seconded the motion. The motion carried.

I. Approval of the minutes of the December 7, 1978 meeting. The motion to approve the minutes was made by Dr. Grabowski and seconded by Prof. Brasted. The motion passed.

II. Announcements.
There were no announcements.

III. Old Business

A. Amendment of the constitution with regard to the election of Faculty Senators (second reading).

Chairman Ottinger read the proposed constitutional amendment and asked for a motion of approval. Dr. Bucci moved that the amendment be approved. Dr. Grabowski seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Chairman Ottinger appointed a committee consisting of Dr. Monroe and Dr. Valuska to editorially fit the newly approved amendment to the constitution. No substantive changes will be made in the editorial process.

IV. New Business

A. Report of the Curriculum Committee.

Prof. Schellenberg made a motion to change the name of the Advertising Design program to the Communication Design program. Prof. Schellenberg then asked to make Art 248, Introduction to Life Drawing, a requirement for graduation with a B.F.A. in Advertising Design (Communication Design). This addition will raise the number of required credits for specific art studio courses within the major from 33 to 36 credits. Prof. Schellenberg also moved to allow six credits of Business Administration to be counted with in the 80 studio hours required for Advertising Design. Dr. Sexton seconded the packaged motion of Prof. Schellenberg. Motion carried.

Prof. Schellenberg made motions with Dr. Sexton seconding to approve the rewritten syllabi for Graphic Design series of courses. The courses are Graphic Design I, II, III and IV, numbered Art 171, 172, 271 and 371 respectively, plus two courses entitled Art - Television Graphics, and Art 3 - Portfolio Seminar, which have been rewritten and retitled as a result of the series revisions. Then Prof. Schellenberg also included in the package prerequisite changes as follows:

Art 135, Lettering

Prerequisites: Art 25, Drawing I; Art 125, Drawing II; Art 40, Two Dimensional Design and Art 180, Three-Dimensional Design, or permission of the Communication Design Faculty.

Art 230, Production Processes

Prerequisites: Art 135, Lettering; Art 240 Typography, or permission of the Communication Design Faculty.

Art 240, Typography

Prerequisites: Art 25, Drawing I; Art 125, Drawing II; Art 40, Two-Dimensional Design and Art 180, Three-Dimensional Design, or permission of the Communication Design Faculty.

Art 251, Illustration I

the Communication Design Faculty.

Prerequisites: Art 25, Drawing I; Art 125, Drawing II; Art 40 Two-Dimensional Design; Art 248, Intro to Life Drawing and Art 227, Applied Color, or permission of the Communication Design Faculty.

Art 351, 352, Illustration II and III Prerequisite: Art 251, Illustration I or permission of

Art 363, Communication Design Workshop
Prerequisite: Satisfactory completion of all courses
leading to senior status in Communication Design.

Art 394, Communication Design Internship
Prerequisite: Satisfactory completion of all courses
leading to senior status in Communication design.

The motion carried.

Prof. Schellenberg moved and Prof. Brasted seconded that Library Ol-, Materials and Search Strategies: Humanities, Science, Social Science; the library course for liberal arts student to count in category V of general education. The motion carried.

Prof. Schellenberg moved and Dr. Gundry seconded to add the following Physical Education program changes:

- a. P.E. 121A and P.E. 122B will no longer carry the A and B lettering.
- b. P.E. 121 remain in the required category and be continued as a 2-credit (3 clock hours) course, carrying the title Movement Education for Children.
- c. P.E. 301 will remain in the required category, and students will be required to complete 9 hours in the concentration prior to electing P.E. 301 or obtain permission of the course instructor for admission.
- d. P.E. 141 will remain an elective and be changed from 1 credit (2 clock hours) to 1 credit (1 clock hour).
- e. P.E. 122, P.E. 125, P.E. 135, P.E. 131 will be offered under the prefix P.E. 100 A,B,C,D. Students could elect P.E. 100 for 1 to 4 credits with a recommendation that students elect a minimum of 2 credits when choosing P.E. 100
 - A 122 Individual Developmental Movement Activities for Children
 - B 125 Group Developmental Movement Activities for Children

P.E. 100

- C 131 Rhythmic Activities for Children
- D 135 Aquatics for Children

The motion carried.

Prof. Schellenberg moved and Dr. Grabowski seconded that the Sociology program add the Criminal Justice discipline to the list of disciplines from which students may select concomitant courses. The motion carried.

Prof. Schellenberg moved and Dr. Grabowski seconded the following course proposals:

- (1) Psychology 2--; Selected Topics of Psychology.
- (2) Political Science 3--; Law and Sex-Based Discrimination.
- (3) Music 1--; Workshop on Music and Musicians in England.

Deletions to be made of the words "Eaton Hall." Add the word "musical" on the second paragraph befor the word "world."

- (4) Music 1--; British Music. Deletions to be made of the words "Eaton Hall."
- (5) History 2--; Europe of the World Wars. The words "three semester hours" are to be added after the first paragraph.
- (6) English/History 2--; The Age of Elizabeth. This is a dual listing, team taught course for majors and non-majors.
 - (7) Theatre 195; Theatre Workshop.
- (8) Geography 125; Geography of Oceania. This course is to be dropped from the curriculum.
- (9) Marine Science 380; Senior Seminar in Marine Science. The motion carried.

B. Graduate Council Business

Dr. Hershberger made a motion and Dr. Lawfer seconded to approve the course from Counselor Education; Counseling 5--; Seminar in Advanced Counseling Strategies, Techniques, and Processes. The motion carried.

C. Policy on withdrawal from developmental courses.

Dr. Warzeski moved and Dr. Innocenti seconded a motion calling for the latest date for withdrawal from a developmental course will be the same as for credit courses. Students will get a withdrawal-satisfactory (WS) for a withdrawal-unsatisfactory (WU) grade. Dr. Warzeski amended the motion to state that students who withdraw in the last two weeks of school will receive a WU grade. The motion passed as amended.

D. Policy on cut-off scores for developmental mathematics.

Dr. Warzeski moved and Dr. Evans seconded a motion that effective spring semester 1980, all entering students with scholastic aptitude test quantitative (mathematical) scores of 360 or lower, or those entering without SAT scores being presented, shall be required to register and satisfactorily complete the requirements of Developmental Mathematics 000, in a semester prior to the one in which registration takes place. Exemption may be granted by the department chairman. The motion carried.

The Chairman asked for a motion to adjourn.

Prof. Kulseth made a motion to adjourn. Dr. Lauer seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:45 p.m.
