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**PACES Report
February 6, 2008**

At the PACES meeting held during the 2007 PCA conference, members decided that PACES should not create a list of eligible LPC post-masters supervisors. Critical concerns included not wanting to infringe on the work of the licensure board as to who would have appropriate credentials to provide post-masters supervision and that PACES wants to direct their energies in supporting initiatives that train counselors for post-masters supervision.

To that end, on Friday January 11th members of PACES met with Dr. Maura Kushinski, PCA conference chair to discuss having a “Counselor Education and Supervision” Day at the 2008 PCA conference on Friday October 31, 2008. Several topics that we would like to have included would be 1) Hot topics in Counselor Education and Supervision; 2) LPC Supervisor requirements; 3) Ethical Issues in Supervision; and 4) Risk Management.

On Friday, January 11th PACES cosponsored with GPCA a workshop entitled “Legal and Ethical Issues in Post-Masters Supervision” in Pittsburgh during a GPCA quarterly meeting.
