Minutes of the Faculty Senate Meeting
March 1, 1973

The Faculty Senate met on Thursday, March 1, 1973, in the Library Science Reading Room, Rohrbach Library, at 4:00 p.m.

Guests present were Dr. Roger Whitcomb, Chairman of the Interim Semester Committee; Prof. William Kanasky, Chairman of the Curriculum Committee; Dr. Joseph Peters, and Dr. James Tinsman.

OLD BUSINESS

Dr. Monroe asked for a motion to approve or correct the minutes of the February 1, 1973, meeting. Prof. Ottinger moved that the minutes be approved. Dr. Drumm seconded the motion and it carried.

Announcements

Dr. Newman reminded members that the names of the new departmental senators or re-elected senators must be submitted by March 15. A written reminder will be included in the Faculty Brief on Monday, March 5.

Dr. Monroe noted that there are a number of volatile issues to be presented at the coming meetings and asked that members cooperate in maintaining order and decorum.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Prof. Ottinger moved to adopt a resolution calling for a general faculty meeting to discuss the proposal for the Interim Semester. Prof. Willits seconded the motion. Dr. Whitcomb discussed the findings of the Interim Semester Committee which he chairs. Prof. Ottinger moved that those speaking to the issue be limited to two minutes each. There was no second.

Following further discussion, Prof. Ottinger moved to suspend debate. Prof. Foust seconded the motion and it carried. The original motion carried. Dr. Monroe announced that, pending the outcome of the vote, a general faculty meeting had been tentatively scheduled for 4 p.m., Thursday, March 8, 1973, in the auditorium of the Research and Learning Center.

- 2. Prof. Kanasky introduced the proposals passed by the Curriculum Committee.
- Prof. Wetherhold moved for approval of Proposal A: Selected Topics in Geology. Prof. Mobley seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Willits moved for approval of Proposal B: <u>History of Technology</u>. Dr. Goldberg seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Goldberg moved for approval of Proposal C: <u>U. S. History: The Formative Years;</u> Proposal D: <u>U. S. History: The Federal Republic;</u> and Proposal E: <u>U. S. History: The Emergence of Modern America.</u> These three courses were designed to replace Hist. 21 and Hist. 22, <u>History of the United States and Pennsylvania A and B. Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried.</u>
- Prof. Willits moved for approval of Proposal F: <u>History of Civilization: A, B, C</u> These three courses were designed to replace Hist. 11 and Hist. 12, <u>History of Civilization A and B</u>. Prof. Miller seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Monroe asked that the Sub-Committee on Curricular Affairs consider the issue of the Faculty Senate's reviewing individual course proposals.
- Dr. Monroe requested that the Graduate Council consider using a syllabus format such as the one presently in use by the Curriculum Committee.
 - Dr. Drumm introduced the first packet of Graduate Council Business.
- Dr. Drumm moved for approval of the course entitled The Community College. Dr. Evans seconded the motion. A lengthy discussion followed and Prof. Felkay moved to close debate. There was no second. The question was then called for and the motion carried, 12 to 11.
- Prof. Ottinger moved for approval of the course entitled <u>Unified Mathematics</u>. Dr. Schatkowski seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Drumm moved for approval of courses entitled <u>Techniques in Environmental Education</u> and <u>Cell Physiology</u>. Prof. Ottinger seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Newman moved for approval of the course entitled <u>Studies in Renaissance</u> <u>Literature</u>. Dr. Evans seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Drumm moved to add one previously approved course entitled Hum. 590 Arts in Contemporary Culture to the English program under the area of Specialization. Prof. Willits seconded the motion and it carried.
 - Dr. Drumm introduced the second packet of Graduate Council Business.
- Prof. Snyder moved for approval of Ed 515B Open Approach Education. Prof. Liddicoat seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Wetherhold asked that the remainder of the Graduate Council Business be postponed so that members could review the material being presented. The request was denied by Dr. Monroe. Prof. Wetherhold appealed the overruling. There was no second.

- Prof. Klucsarits moved for approval of <u>The Social Studies Curriculum: Prospects</u> and Problems. Prof. Miller seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Klucsarits moved for approval of <u>Guided Research Project</u>. Prof. Miller seconded the motion. Prof. Klucsarits moved to amend the second page of the course syllabi by deleting the sentence within the parentheses in the first paragraph. Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried. The original motion carried as amended.
- Prof. Ottinger moved for approval of <u>Conceptual Foundations in History and Social Science</u>. Prof. Arnold seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Miller moved for approval of Research Methods in History and the Social Sciences. Dr. Goldberg seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Drumm moved for approval of Endowment and Heritage of Man. Prof. Miller seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Goldberg moved for approval of <u>Selected American Economic Issues</u>. Prof. Liddicoat seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Klucsarits moved for approval of Economics of Consumerism. Dr. Evans seconded the motion. The motion was defeated.
- Dr. Drumm moved for approval of <u>Indian-White Relations in North America</u>, from the <u>Earliest Contacts to Wounded Knee</u>. Prof. Miller seconded the motion and it carried.
- Dr. Drumm moved for approval of <u>The Human Dimension in International Politics</u>. Prof. Felkay seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Arnold moved for approval of <u>Politics and the Environment</u>. Prof. Miller seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Klucsarits moved for approval of <u>Social Class in Modern Society</u>. Dr. Evans seconded the motion and it carried.
- Prof. Ottinger moved for approval of <u>The Graduate Program in Social Sciences as revised</u>. Prof. Arnold seconded the motion. Prof. Kendall moved for an amendment to include available graduate-level geography courses in the Social Science program. Prof. Mobley seconded the motion. The motion was defeated. The original motion carried.
- Prof. Ottinger moved to adjourn. Dr. Cook seconded the motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 6 p.m.
