Senate Minutes 3-13-67

The meeting of the Faculty Senate was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Robert Hedrick at 4:00 p.m., Thursday, March 16, 1967 in the Conference Room.

Those present were: Dr. Beekey, Dr. Drumm, Dr. Dustan, Mr. David Evans, Dr. Kaiser, Mr. Knedler, Mrs. R. Mathias, Dr. Monroe, Mr. Patton, Dr. Prentiss, Dr. Skeath, Mr. Slick, Dr. Seikman for Mr. R. Thomas, Mr. Tinsman, Dr. Weiss, Mr. J. Collier for Miss Willits, and Mrs. Yost. Dr. Mantz was absent and Mr. Foust was a visitor.

The secretary corrected the omission of Dr. Drumm's name from the minutes of January 5, 1967. A notation to change, in B under Paragraph 5 to read International Relations instead of International Organization. The move to accept the minutes as corrected was made by Dr. Drumm and the second by Dr. Kaiser.

The report of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Student Advisory Program was read by Dr. Skeath. He moved its adoption, Mr. Patton made the second. The motion passed.

Dr. Prentiss presented the revised course description of Geo-morphology for acceptance. Mr. Slick and Dr. Drumm offered the motion and second. The motion passed.

Dr. Hedrick complimented Mr. Foust and his committee on the fine work as an Ad Hoc Committee to study Enrollment of Undergraduates in Graduate Courses. Mr. Tinsman made the motion that the Faculty Senate approve for the summer of 1967 the following courses -

| 2. Mediterranean Study Tour | 3 semester credits |
| 3. Improvement of Human Relations in School and Community " | |
| 4. Shakespeare on the Stage | 3 semester credits |

for Undergraduate Credit for Undergraduates and Graduate credit for Graduate students. It is understood that Graduate students will do work at a higher level than Undergraduates, and this report will be reviewed at the first scheduled Faculty Senate meeting in the fall of 1967. Following a second on the motion by Dr. Kaiser the motion passed.

Dr. Prentiss, Chairman of the Committee on Curriculum and Research presented the following items for consideration and action.

1. Revision of Social Worker Sequence within the Liberal Arts program to include a course in Community Organization for 3 semester hours credit a two semester year course Seminar in Social Welfare for 8 semester hours credit. The motion passed on Dr. Prentiss' move and Dr. Kaiser's second.

2. Dr. Skeath moved and Dr. Kaiser seconded the acceptance of the course Child Welfare and the Law to be offered by the Department of Education for 3 semester hours credit. Motion passed.
3. A curriculum for Special Education for the Mentally Retarded and the Elementary Education Sequence was presented for adoption. On a move by Dr. Skeath and a second by Dr. Kaiser the motion passed.
4. It was suggested that Physics 178, Descriptive Astronomy be expanded to a two semester course for 3 semester hours credit each and a course for 3 semester hours credit be offered, entitled Astronomical Instrumentation. Dr. Prentiss moved its acceptance. Mr. Slick made the second. The motion passed.
5. After much discussion Dr. Kaiser moved that a revised Earth Science Major in the Liberal Arts program be returned to the Committee on Curriculum and Research for further study. The second was made by Mr. Slick. Motion passed.
6. The Department of Speech and Theatre requested that Speech 212, Fundamentals of Acting become a two semester course, for 3 semester hours credit each, and each semester may be taken independently of the other. Dr. Prentiss moved and Mr. Slick gave the second. The motion passed.
7. Dr. Prentiss moved and Mrs. Yost seconded the motion that English 1A be a prerequisite for English 1B. Passed.
8. Geo. 10, Elements of Geography should be listed as a prerequisite for all later Geography courses. Dr. Prentiss and Mr. Slick moved and seconded the suggestion. Motion passed.
9. It was requested that the title of Special Education 160 from Methods of Evaluating the Visually Handicapped be changed to Evaluating the Visually Handicapped. The motion passed on Dr. Prentiss' move and Mr. Slick's second.
10. A request for approval of two additional courses in Philosophy was made. Symbolic Logic for 3 semester hours credit and Philosophy of Religion, also 3 semester hours credit. Dr. Prentiss moved the adoption and Dr. Kaiser offered the second. It was suggested that the Philosophy staff try and shorten the description for the catalogue. The motion passed.
11. The Faculty Senate approved the titles and ideas presented in the suggestion to change English 350, Victorian Literature to two semester courses for 3 semester hours credit each, but suggested the English Department alter the titles and wording of the description. Dr. Prentiss made the motion and Dr. Dustan offered the second.

12. The Department of History and Political Science requested the expansion of History 327, Russia and the Soviet Union to a two semester course; each course would carry 3 semester hours credit. Titles would read: Russia from the 9th to the 19th and Imperial Russia and the Soviet Union. The motion was made by Dr. Prentiss with the addition that either course may be taken independently. Mr. Slick seconded it. Motion passed.
13. The Department of History and Political Science requested the addition of two more courses each for 3 semester hours credit; The Government of the Soviet Union and Emerging Nations of Africa and Asia. Dr. Prentiss and Mr. J. Collier moved and seconded the request. Passed.

The next scheduled meeting of the Faculty Senate will be held in the Conference Room on Thursday, May 11, 1967 at 4:00 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 5:25 p.m.
