Minutes of Faculty Senate Meeting May 15, 1975

The continued meeting of the Faculty Senate was called to order by Chairman Ottinger at 4:00 p.m. on May 15, 1975.

CURRICULUM COMMITTEE BUSINESS

All Curriculum Committee and Graduate Council proposals presented for this meeting had been received after the April 1 deadline date set by the Senate for receipt of such proposals. (See minutes of September 12, 1974.) Dr. Evans moved, with second by Dr. Goldberg, to consider all proposals presented even though they had been received after the April 1 deadline. The motion carried by the necessary two-thirds majority.

The following proposals were approved by the Senate upon motion of those whose names are given in parentheses after the proposal title:

1. Proposal by the Department of Fine Arts to change course prefixes as follows: Each of the courses Art 010, 020, 170, 301, 302, 303, 305, 306, 307, 308, 309, 332, 333, 335, 338, 339, 340, 350 and 380 is to be given a new prefix "AH" (for Art History) rather than "Art". The course numbers are to remain the same, i. e., AH 010, AH 020, AH 170, ..., AH 380. (Dr. Dreisbach and Prof. Keller)

Prof. Kanasky and Prof. Keller moved approval of all three proposals. Dr. Monroe and Prof. Trollinger moved to amend the motion by having the Senate act only on the pass/fail proposal for Art 394. The

amending motion failed to carry, whereupon the original motion of approval also failed to carry.

GRADUATE COUNCIL BUSINESS

The following 400-level course proposals were approved upon motion of those whose names are given in parentheses after the proposal title:

- 1. Pol S 4 : Public Policy Analysis (Prof. Klucsarits and Prof. Goldberg)
- 2. Psy 4_: Behavior Modification Procedures (Dr. Cook and Dr. Law)
- 3. Math 4_: Numerical Analysis (Dr. Evans and Prof. Klucsarits)

PROPOSAL FOR AMENDMENT TO SENATE CONSTITUTION

At the March 6, 1975 meeting of the Senate, Prof. Foust and Prof. Keller had moved to amend the constitution by <u>deleting</u> Item 2, Section C of Article VI, which reads:

"Standing committees shall be concerned only with such business as may be referred to them by the Chairman of the Senate."

Action on this motion was delayed until this time so that each Senator could discuss the proposed amendment in his or her department.

After considerable discussion by the Senate, the amending motion failed to carry.

PROPOSAL FROM COLLEGE COMMITTEE ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Dr. Dreisbach presented a proposal from the College Committee on Academic Affairs concerning credit for CLEP tests and moved approval of the proposal. Dr. Dent seconded the motion.

After some discussion, Dr. Warzeski and Prof. Klucsarits moved to cut off debate on the proposal. The motion failed.

At 5:45 p. m. Chairman Ottinger recessed the meeting due to lack of a quorum, indicating that the Senate would convene again on Friday, May 23, at 10:00 a. m.
