- Final editing and composition work is taking place with the "What Works in School Counseling" project. The target for distribution for PSCA and PCA members is early December.

- Since the last PCA board meeting, PSCA held its first ever School Counselor Academy on August 8,9,10 at the Lancaster Host Resort and Conference Center. With over 80 registrants and national level speakers, who were well received, the professional development event is seen as a great start to what will likely prove to be an annual offering. At the academy, participants learned:
 - How to use the ASCA National Model as a tool to maximize the impact of the school counseling program on students' academic achievement and career and personal/social development.
 - How to modify the school counseling program to effect greater change and enhance the leadership and advocate roles of the school counselor.
 - How to collect and use data to describe problems, plan interventions, and demonstrate that what school counselors do does make a significant difference in student achievement.
 - How to identify and change systemic barriers to student achievement.
 - The role of the school counselor in Pennsylvania's educational reform initiatives, such as Page 1 and Project 720.
