Minutes of the Faculty Senate Meeting
December 22, 1972

The Faculty Senate met on Friday, December 22, 1972, in the Library Science Reading Room, Rohrbach Library, at 10:00 a.m.

Announcements

Dr. Monroe asked that all substitutes at the meeting list the name of the Senator for whom they were substituting on the attendance roster and also pointed out that the substitutes enjoyed the full rights of Faculty Senators at this special meeting.

New Business

1. Dr. Harris, representing the Curriculum Committee, introduced the package of proposals recently approved by the Curriculum Committee.

a. Dr. Harris moved that an English course entitled Literature and Film (3 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried.

b. Some explanation of the development of the Art History program bearing on the next group of curriculum changes ensued.

(1.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled Black Art (3 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Banta seconded the motion and it carried.

(2.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled Primitive Art (3 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Klucsarits seconded the motion and it carried.

(3.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled The Art of Northern Europe: 1350-1580 (3 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried.

(4.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled European Art: 1580-1780 (3 s.h.) be approved. Dr. Goldberg seconded the motion and it carried.

(5.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled Art Since 1950 (3 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried.

(6.) Dr. Harris moved that Art 130--20th Century Painting (3 s.h.) be discontinued after being offered in the fall of 1972. Prof. Banta seconded the motion and it carried.

(7.) Dr. Harris moved that an Art course entitled Senior Seminar in the History of Art (2 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Gallo seconded the motion and it carried.

c. Dr. Harris moved that a Political Science internship course entitled Federal, State, and/or Local Government Internship (12 s.h.) be approved. Prof. Willits seconded the motion. Prof. Klucsarits was given the floor to explain, discuss, and answer questions about this internship course. The motion was then carried.

d. Dr. Harris moved that the following program changes be made in the existing B.S. in Chemistry:

(1.) Reduce the number of semester hours under "Elective Courses" from 12 to 6;

(2.) Increase the number of semester hours under "Electives" from 10 to 16 but eliminate the restriction against chemistry courses under this category.

Prof. Wetherhold seconded the motion and it carried.

e. Dr. Harris moved that the following program change be made in the existing B.A. in Natural Science, Concentration in Chemistry:

"On page 30 of the 1971-72 Undergraduate Bulletin, eliminate Research in Chemistry (2 s.h.) as a requirement under the chemistry category."

Prof. Klucsarits seconded the motion and it carried.

2. Dr. Harris moved that the effective date of all of the above curriculum proposals be January 1, 1973. Dr. Evans seconded the motion and it carried.

3. Dr. Harris announced that after consulting with the Chairman of the Faculty Senate, it was decided that certain minor matters approved by the Curriculum Committee, such as changes in course designations, would not be brought before the Faculty Senate.

4. Dr. Monroe asked Faculty Senators to check carefully the APSCUF contract's statements about the structure and responsibilities of the Merit Increment Committee and the Sabbatical Leave Committee prior to the next meeting so that they could consider documents from these committees more knowledgeably.

Prof. Wetherhold moved to adjourn the meeting. Prof. Klucsarits seconded the

motion and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 10:40 a.m.
